

MSW/MPH DUAL DEGREE Curriculum Snapshot Children, Youth, and Families

The MSW/MPH dual degree requires completion of 82 units, including 48 units in Social Work, 34 units in Public Health, and 20 units which fulfill requirements for both degrees.
