About The Graduate Certificate

Affiliated with the USC Suzanne Dworak-Peck Center for Homelessness, Housing & Health Equity Research, this certificate offers advanced training to promote the discovery and dissemination of evidence-based solutions to reduce homelessness and health disparities. The certificate acquaints students with the history and current status of homelessness in the United States with a particular focus on Los Angeles that has the largest unsheltered population in the country. Students learn about how homelessness, and responses to homelessness, have been differently conceived, defined, measured, and prioritized.

*Students who are able to participate in the Los Angeles Homeless Count are eligible to receive a stipend.
