Affiliated with the Center for Homelessness, Housing & Health Equity Research, the Ending Homelessness graduate certificate offers advanced training to promote the discovery and dissemination of evidence-based solutions to reduce homelessness and health disparities.

The Ending Homelessness graduate certificate acquaints students with the history and current status of homelessness in the United States, with a particular focus on Los Angeles County which has the largest unsheltered population in the country. Learn how homelessness, and responses to homelessness, have been differently conceived, defined, measured and prioritized region to region.

Students in the Ending Homelessness graduate certificate may also participate in the annual Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count, and are eligible to receive a stipend for their service.

The Ending Homelessness certificate is available to all Master of Social Work students (on-campus and online options), and graduate students or employed professionals from other disciplines.

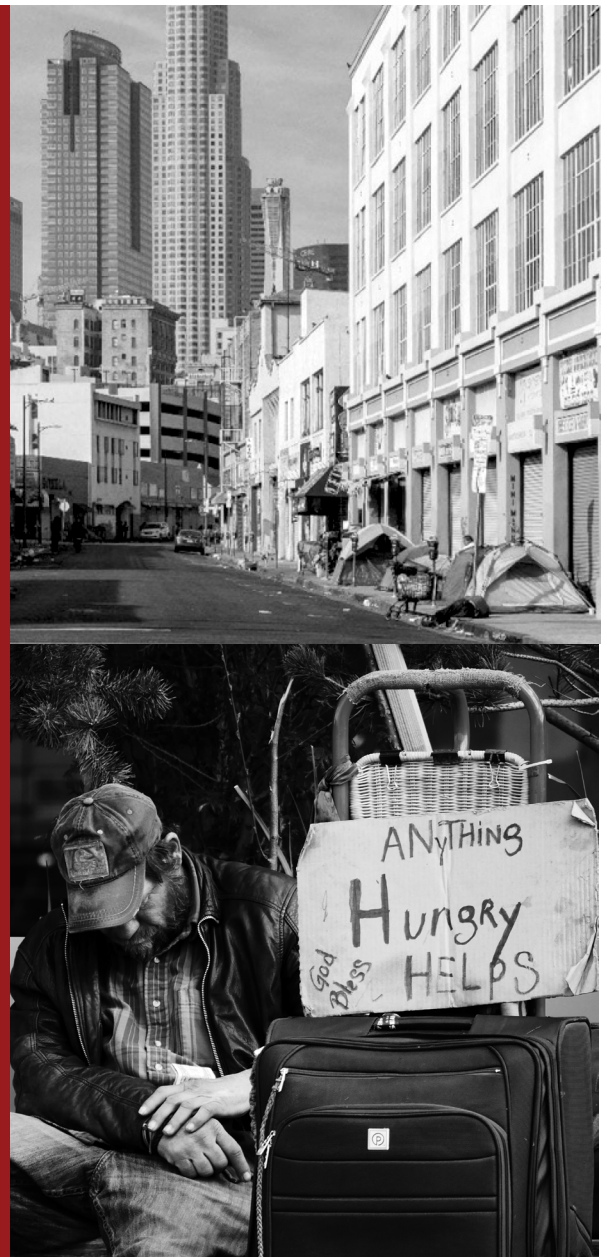
